

FINAL RESULTS

ReachTEL conducted a survey of 886 residents across the federal electorate of Wentworth during the night of 27th August 2018.

Question 1:

If a federal election were to be held today, which of the following would receive your first preference vote?

The new Prime Minister Scott Morrison famously brought a lump of coal into Question Time during a parliament house sitting. Does this make you more or less likely to vote Liberal at the next election?

Labor's proposed target is 45%. The Greens' proposed target is 63-82%.
