At Uluru the NT First Nations Peoples felt the racist clause need to be dealt with. What happened with that?

Question

For decades Yolngu , and other Nations across the NT have been calling for Treaty. Statement From the Heart includes Truth Telling and Treaty . Why has a non-binding voice become the focus only? The neo-colonial onslaught continues to be full on in the Northern Territory since PM Howard era. Since Traditional Owners and Elders have been excluded and denied their Voice and their structural authority. Consequently, communities are confused, and disharmony has increased . As Government disrespected voices so to have the children. Overtly discriminatory policies are still in action. Yolngu (and other Nations in then NT) are calling for Treaty (including Federal) processes to commence now, as also revealed by the recent NT Treaty report.
