This is a win for Victoria's economy, communities, climate and wildlife.

Dear Premier Jeremy Rockliff

It's time for lutruwita/Tasmania to follow suit and protect our native forests.

Successive Tasmanian Governments have provided over \$1 billion in subsidies to the Tasmanian Forestry industry over the past 20 years. This money could be invested elsewhere, for nurses, for teachers and for new homes.

The majority of Tasmania's native forests end up as woodchips and waste.

It is not essential for housing. We use plantation-based pine for housing frames.

Australia remains the only developed nation on WWF's list of global deforestation fronts.

Aotearoa/New Zealand stopped logging its native forests in 2002 and today has a thriving plantation forestry industry.

Now is the time to protect Tasmania's irreplaceable native forests and support native forestry workers to move to sustainable industries.
