

## **FINAL RESULTS**

uComms conducted a survey of 821 residents across the federal seat of Kooyong on behalf of The Australia Institute during the evenings of 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> July 2023 using self-completed automated voice polling methodologies.
