




Umbrella legislation that links (coordinates) across other marine legislation

Tasmanian meso-scale bioregions (9), IMCRA v4.0

The TIME Act would include 7 parts:

Part 1: Purpose, objectives and principles

Part 2: Marine Estate Management Strategy

Part 3: Marine spatial planning

Part 4: Marine Estate Authority

Part 5: Public participation

Part 6: Compliance and enforcement

Part 7: Review

Key players within the proposed Tasmanian marine planning system

State Agencies & Ministers

NRE, MAST, others Support the planning system at the policy & strategic level

TASCAT – Resource & Planning System

Resolves appeals against planning decisions

Minister for Planning

Provides overarching direction & articulates overnment's vision for the planning system

Tasmanian Marine Planning System

Marine Estate Authority

Independent authority that prepares Strategy, undertakes marine spatial planning & prepares Marine Plans, enforces planning rules

Environmental Protection Authority

Assess impacts of new developments, regulate existing activities

Tasmanian Planning Commission

Independent authority that reviews, advises on, & determines a range of land & sea use matters
