uComms conducted a survey of 1174 residents across Tasmania on behalf of The Australia Institute during the evening of 04 - 05 March 24 using self-completed automated voice and SMS polling methodologies.

Question:

To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement?

"The Tasmanian Integrity Commission should be replaced with a new, fit for purpose anti-corruption commission, with stronger mechanisms to investigate misconduct and corruption in public administration?"
