



FINAL RESULTS

When interpreting this document, please consider the following items:

- All figures have been weighted to be representative of Australian voters (the target population).
- All results are based on percentages and have been rounded to 0 decimal places
- For the banner "2025 federal vote" all party names have been abbreviated as follows:
 - o ALP Labor
 - o COA Liberal / National Coalition
 - o GRE Greens
 - o ON Pauline Hanson's One Nation
 - o IND Independent
 - o Other Other parties

Methodology:

YouGov conducted a national survey of 1,535 voters on behalf of The Australia Institute between 6 and 11 June 2025, using an online survey polling methodology. Full details are provided in the methodology statement. The poll is compliant with the Australian Polling Council's requirements.

Question 1

The Australian Government is proposing to reduce tax concessions for people with more than \$3 million in superannuation. This policy would affect around 80,000 people and collect an extra \$2.7 billion in revenue each year. Do you support or oppose this policy? (single select)

Key findings - Over half (52%) of Australian voters support a proposal by the Australian Government to reduce tax concessions for people with more than \$3 million in superannuation while just over 1 in 4 (26%) oppose this proposal.

Support is strongest among people between the ages of 25 and 49, Labor party voters and Independent voters from the 2025 federal election.

Question 2

If the government reduces tax concessions for people with more than \$3 million in superannuation would this: (single select)

Key findings – Only around 1 in 5 (21%) of Australian voters expect a reduction in tax concessions for people with more than \$3 million in superannuation to impact their income; only 6% of this group expect a major impact.

People over the age of 50 are the most likely to expect no impact while people aged between the ages of 18 to 34 are the most unsure on what impact this may have on them.

Question 3

If the government collects an extra \$2.7 billion per year by reducing tax concessions for people with more than \$3 million in superannuation would this: (single select)

Key findings – Half (50%) of Australian voters believe that the government collecting an extra \$2.7 billion per year by reducing tax concessions for people with more than \$3 million in superannuation will make no difference to who they vote for; just under 1 in 5 (19%) expect this to make them more likely to vote for Labor at the next election.

People aged between 18-34 show the highest likelihood to vote Labor at the next election off the back of this change while people in South Australia and Coalition voters show the strongest scores of being less likely to support Labor at the next election based on this proposal.

Question 4

In your view, what is the main purpose of Australia's superannuation system for you? (multiple select)

Key findings – Nearly 3 in 4 (72%) Australian voters believe the main purpose of Australia's superannuation system is to fund their retirement. Over half (53%) show a belief that it is also there to reduce the reliance on the aged pension.

People aged between 18-24 show a higher likelihood to believe Australia's superannuation system is there to create an inheritance for dependents (34% and to reduce the amount of tax paid on their income (21%).
