- *For the banner “2025 federal vote” & “Tasmanian election planned vote” all party names have been abbreviated as follows:*
 - *ALP – Labor*
 - *LIB – Liberal party*
 - *GRN – Greens*
 - *IND – Independent*
 - *Other – Other parties*

Methodology:

YouGov conducted a survey of 842 Tasmanian voters on behalf of The Australia Institute between 12 and 16 June 2025, using an online survey polling methodology. Full details are provided in the methodology statement. The poll is compliant with the Australian Polling Council's requirements.

To minimise potential order effects and reduce the risk of response bias, the two items within module Q1 were randomised in presentation order. This approach ensures that respondents' attitudes toward one party are not unintentionally influenced by the prior framing or positioning of the other, thereby improving the reliability and validity of the data.

Question 1a

To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: If the Labor Party is not elected in its own right, then Labor should seek to form a government by working with the Greens and independents on the crossbench (single select)

Key findings – Just over half (55%) of Tasmanian voters agree that if Labor is not elected in their own right that they should seek to form government with Greens, Independents and the crossbench.

61% of Labor voters agree with the statement, and 25% oppose. Less than one in ten Labor voters (9%) strongly disagree.

Key findings – Just under half (48%) of Tasmanian voters believe that if the Liberal party is not elected in their own right that they should seek to form government with Greens, Independents and the crossbench.
